Dan Gray playing his best game of the year accounted for the touchdowns for Lyons by grabbing a fumble at the Pirates 12 and prancing 88 yards to tie the score. Jacky Amerson's successful PAT put us ahead. Midway in the

4th quarter, Gray, Brown and Wilkes joined forces to produce the 2nd Touch Down.

26 Lyons VS. Montgomery County 14

First quarter was scoreless as the Rebels fought hard against one of their main rivals. Early in the second quarter, Ronnie Kemp intercepted a Rebel pass at the Lyons 32 and raced back 68 yards for a TD. The PAT missed. Our second scoring play resulted when the Rebels failed to move and the ball went over. Greg Wilke passed to J.B. Cone for a spectacular show-a perfect pass, and Cone moved the rest of the way. Amerson's PAT was good. With 40 seconds remaining in the first half, The Rebels recovered a Wilkes fumble and chalked up their first six points. Midway in the third quarter they did it again. This time the attack began with a well executed fake kick. The run for the point after was subdued.

Our Dogs snapped right back. Brown gobbled up the off sides kick at Montgomery's 48, and marched for 23. Stewart pushed for one, a rebel penalty, Wilkes carried for 1. With the ball on the 5, Wilkes passed to Gray in the end Zone. The kick was wide. Our next TD scored by Lynn Stewart came early in the 4th quarter. The Rebels still kicking scored again on a recovered fumble, but it was too late and the dogs again brought in a victory.
